Value Added Services(1)(2)

You can customise your FedEx services to your needs (or the needs of your recipients) with value added services from FedEx Express. The following are descriptions of the fees applicable to value added services.

Diplomatic Bag (Diplomatic Mail)	We accept diplomatic shipments for delivery between embassies and consulates of the same country/territory for delivery by International Priority service to direct-served countries/territories. Diplomatic Bags receive diplomatic immunity from inspection or delay under the Vienna Convention of 1961.	None
Hold at FedEx Location	As an alternative to a business or residential delivery, you can choose Hold at FedEx Location (HAL), and have recipients pick up their shipments at a FedEx Express location. Subject to availability.	None





Surcharges(1)(2)

Your transportation costs may be affected by additional charges. The following are descriptions of the surcharges.

Service ⁽¹⁾	Definition	Fees ⁽²⁾ (SZL)
Additional Handling Surcharge	Effective January 6, 2025, FedEx will assess an Additional Handling Surcharge per eligible package for international multi-piece shipments, instead of per shipment. Package Services An Additional Handling Surcharge applies to any package that meets any of the following criteria: Dimension • measures greater than 121 centimeters along its longest side; • measures greater than 266 centimeters along its second-longest side; or, • measures greater than 266 centimeters in length and girth (L+2W+2H). Weight • has an actual weight greater than 31kg. Packaging • is not fully encased in an outer shipping container; • is encased in an outer shipping container not made of corrugated fibreboard (cardboard) materials, including but not limited to metal, wood, canvas, leather, hard plastic, soft plastic, or expanded polystyrene foam (e.g. Styrofoam); • is encased in an outer shipping container covered in shrink wrap or stretch wrap; • is round or cylindrical, including (without limitation) mailing tubes, cans, buckets, barrels, tires, drums, or pails; • is bound with metal, plastic, or cloth banding, or has wheels, casters, handles, or straps (e.g., a bicycle) (including packages where the outer surface area is loosely wrapped, or where the contents protrude outside the surface area); • could become entangled in, or cause damage to other packages or the FedEx sortation system. We reserve the right to assess additional handling charges for packages that require special handling or that require FedEx to apply additional packaging during transit. If a package is eligible for 2 or all 3 Additional Handling Surcharges, only 1 with greater charge will apply. Package shape and dimensions may change during transit, which can affect the package's surcharge eligibility. If the dimensions change during transit, FedEx may make appropriate adjustments to the shipment charges at any time. Additional Handling Surcharge – Non-stackable	Effective January 6, 2025, FedEx will assess an Additional Handling Surcharge per eligible package for international multi-piece shipments, instead of per shipment. A surcharge applies to any freight handling unit that is non-stackable, which means the piece, skid, or pallet cannot be stacked vertically in a safe and secure manner. Examples include, but are not limited to, non-stackable freight handling units that: • do not have a flat and stable top or base; • may be damaged if another piece is loaded on them; or, • have flat and stable loading surfaces but are too narrow to safely and securely support other freight handling units (e.g. 1-2 barrels or drums). Fuel Surcharge	International Fuel Surcharge FedEx Express has adopted a Dynamic Fuel Surcharge according to the variation in the price of kerosene-type jet fuel and reserves the right to apply a fuel surcharge.	Go to fedex.com/sz/ fuelsurcharge for updates on the fuel surcharge.

Oversize Charge	Effective January 6, 2025, FedEx will assess an Additional Handling Surcharge per eligible package for international multi-piece shipments, instead of per shipment. An oversize charge applies to a package that exceed 243 centimeters in length* or 330 centimeters in length* and girth (L+2W+2H). Package shape and dimensions may change during transit, which can affect the package's surcharge eligibility. If the dimensions change during transit, FedEx may make appropriate adjustments to the shipment charges at any time.	SZL382/shipment
Third Party Billing	Third Party Billing Surcharge will apply to shipments that are billed to a third party. The surcharge will be charged to the third-party payer ⁽³⁾ . The surcharge applies when the shipper account number and the third party billing account number are not part of the same company, as determined by FedEx.	2.5% of total shipment charges. Total shipment charges includes transportation charges, surcharges and additional fees; but does not include duties, taxes and clearance service fees.
