
## How to prepare for Canada CARM

The Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) Assessment and Revenue Management (CARM) initiative has transformed the management of commercial goods importation into Canada, including duty and tax reporting and collection. This is an industry-wide requirement. If you're a Canadian resident or non-resident business importing commercial goods into Canada, answer the questions below and take the appropriate steps to prepare for CARM, which took effect 10/21/2024.

CCP, in order to obtain "Release Prior to Payment" privilege. Post financial security once, regardless of your choice of brokers. The CBSA has developed a transition plan to assist commercial importers with this requirement. See the CBSA RPP plan for additional details and timelines.

Important: Importers have the option to pay the CBSA directly for their import duties and taxes through the CCP. To avoid duplicate payments being made to the CBSA, importers who want to pay the CBSA directly must notify FedEx Express in advance by completing and submitting this agreement by email. For assistance, see Step 4 above for contact details. Note: FedEx Express® and FedEx Trade Networks® will default to paying the CBSA for any import duties and taxes unless informed by our customers.
